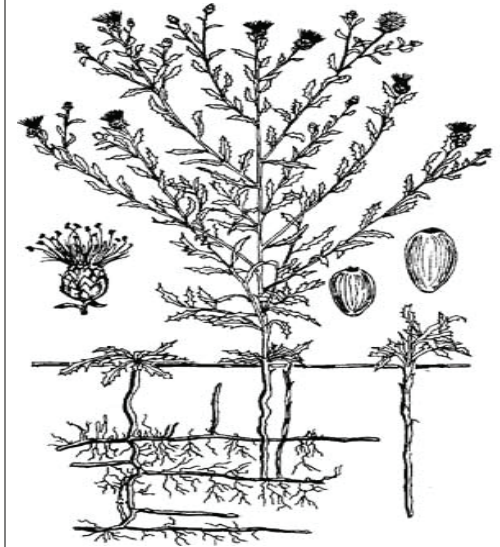

Everyone is invited to the Fourteenth Annual Four Corners Weed Management Symposium.

Weed management is a major issue in the Four Corners Area. Non-native invasive species such as Leafy Spurge and Russian Knapweed long ago gained a foothold in our area and continue to be problematic. Weeds increase erosion, deplete native plant species, reduce crop production potential, out-compete wildlife food sources and are aesthetically displeasing. The economic loss caused by weeds throughout the area is staggering. Crop loss and property values are both part of the economic loss.

The Fourteenth Annual Four Corners Weed Management Symposium will be held March 2, 2006. The program will be presented at the Farmington Civic



Center in Farmington, New Mexico.

The emphasis of the program will be management of weeds for crop and rangeland production in the Four Corners Area. In the past we have placed emphasis on perennial weed species that require long term management strategies. Although, these species will not be forgotten at the 2006 symposium, we will also take a closer look at annual and biennial weed species that affect agricultural production potential.

An industry update will give participants information on new tools that are available for weed management as well as new uses for old tools. As usual a fine meal will be served to all who attend. We look forward to seeing you on March 2nd.
